<b>we</b>	ken

<b>they</b>	ken

### Simple past

<b>I</b>	kenned
<b>you</b>	kenned
<b>he/she/it</b>	kenned
<b>we</b>	kenned
<b>you</b>	kenned
<b>they</b>	kenned

### Present perfect

<b>I</b>	have kenned
<b>you</b>	have kenned
<b>he/she/it</b>	has kenned
<b>we</b>	have kenned
<b>you</b>	have kenned
<b>they</b>	have kenned

### Past perfect

<b>I</b>	had kenned
<b>you</b>	had kenned
<b>he/she/it</b>	had kenned
<b>we</b>	had kenned

## Conditional

### Present continuous

<b>I</b>	am kenning
<b>you</b>	are kenning
<b>he/she/it</b>	is kenning
<b>we</b>	are kenning
<b>you</b>	are kenning
<b>they</b>	are kenning

### Past continuous

<b>I</b>	was kenning
<b>you</b>	were kenning
<b>he/she/it</b>	was kenning
<b>we</b>	were kenning
<b>you</b>	were kenning
<b>they</b>	were kenning

### Present perfect continuous

<b>I</b>	have been kenning
<b>you</b>	have been kenning
<b>he/she/it</b>	has been kenning
<b>we</b>	have been kenning
<b>you</b>	have been kenning
<b>they</b>	have been kenning

### Past perfect continuous

<b>I</b>	had been kenning
<b>you</b>	had been kenning
<b>he/she/it</b>	had been kenning
<b>we</b>	had been kenning
<b>you</b>	had been kenning

### Future continuous

<b>I</b>	will be kenning
<b>you</b>	will be kenning
